Admission / Withdrawal / Termination

Admission:

- Admission to school is considered on the basis of age. merit and vacancy.
- The school reserves the right to grant admission to a student.
- Admission will be cancelled if it is found that the information provided to the school is incorrect.

Withdrawal:

Students can be asked to leave the school on the following grounds.

- Disciplinary a)
- Detention or repeated detentions in a class. As a rule b) only those students will be retained on the rolls of the school who can take the school leaving examination under 18 years of age.
- A child who fails twice in the same class will not be c) permitted to continue his/her studies in the school especially if he/she is over age for that class.
- Those who leave the school in May must in all cases pay the fees for the month of June.
- Transfer Certificates for children withdrawn are not issued until all dues are settled.

NORMS OF PROMOTION

Promotion are granted on the basis of the whole year's work of the pupil, hence the importance of regularity in work.

The final examination is meant to confirm the results of the year's work and is not a promotion examination. Result declared at the end of the year is final in all cases and will not be reconsidered.

The general criteria for promotion is that a student has grasped the subject matters of his/her present class sufficiently well to follow the syllabus of the higher class easily.

Consistent negligence of a subject will not be considered. Deficiency must be made good before promotion. **Re-tests** will be not conducted in any case.

On the basis of the child's assessment during the year he/she will be declared as: Promoted, Conditionally Promoted or Detained.

A child detained for two consecutive years shall have to be withdrawn.

- 4. Every student must be present on the day the school reopens after summer, Christmas, Easter, Puja Vacations and the week before the vacations and examinations. Students who do not abide by this rule expose themselves to disciplinary action. Holidays may not be anticipated or extended.
- Unauthorized absence before vacation and delays to return to school after the vacation will mean readmission to the school.
- 5. Continuous absence for 15 days without a leave application will be considered equivalent to the withdrawal of the student from the school and his/her name will be struck off the roll.
- 6. A Medical Certificate must be produced for absence

due to a contagious illness.

- Students will be allowed sectional religious holidays only with prior permission from the Principal.
- For Planned Programmes prior written permission from the Principal is must.
- 9. All leave must be applied for in writing to the Principal. NO STUDENT SHALL PROCEED ON LEAVE WITHOUT SANCTION AND PERMISSION, SPECIALLY WHEN THE LEAVE EXCEEDS 2 DAYS.
- 10. If any unauthorized ABSENCE EXCEEDS 15 CALENDAR DAYS, the defaulter's NAME WILL BE STRUCK OFF THE ROLLS and considered withdrawn.

CODE OF CONDUCT

A strict discipline will be exercised. Respect for authority is essential.

All Kids Internationalities are expected to

- 1. Obey the school rules.
- 2. Show respect to all.
- 3. Avoid shouting, whistling or running about in the school building.
- 4. Avoid throwing paper stones etc anywhere in or around the school premises.
- 5. Observe all rules of good conduct on vehicle and on the streets while coming to or returning from school.
- 6. Be regular in attendance, punctual diligent in his or her work, neat and clean of exemplary behaviour.
- 7. Be in school on time. The school gate will be closed five minutes after the warning bell.
- 8. In no way disfigure the walls of the school or destroy/damage the school property. Scribbling is forbidden.
- 9. Bring books according to the Time-Table.
- 10. Take pride in wearing the school uniform.
- 11. Look upon people from all parts of the world as their brethren irrespective of their colour or creed.
- 12. Avoid using indecent language.
- 13. Speak in English in the school campus.

School Rules

- Every Student should carry his/her Almanac to school daily.
- 2. Students should arrive at the school before the bell rings (five minutes before the morning assembly).
- 3. The morning bell before a class or assembly is a sign for all to go to the assembly area from their respective class-rooms. This should be done promptly and in silence. As soon as they are in their classes students should get their books ready for the first period.
- 4. Students should be habitually clean and always neatly dressed. The school uniform should be worn on all working days and for all school functions. Students who are shabbily dressed nor not in uniform will be sent back home after three warnings.
- 5. No shouting or whistling is allowed to the school premises.
- 6. It is strictly forbidden to throw anything at any one.
- 7. Care must be taken of all the school property and no students should scratch or spoil the desk or charts or damage any school furniture, write or draw anything on the wall or in any way damage things belonging to others. Damage done even by accident should be reported at once to the class teacher or to the principal. The charges will be borne by the person who is found responsible for the damage.
- 8. Any one who notices something damaged should report the matter even if he/she does not know who had done it. Students are not allowed to bring any sharp instruments to school.
- No books other than textbooks or library books, magazines or papers may be brought to the school without the permission of the Principal.

- 10. Lending or borrowing of money or other articles is not permitted.
- The school is not responsible for goods lost. It is not 11. advisable to bring valuable articles (like expensive watches, fountain pens, items of jewellery) to school.
- Students who come to school with any authorized 12. person should never leave before the attendant arrives. In case of delay, they should not loiter about on the way but be prompt in returning home straight. Student are warned not their way home or to school.
